

ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY

Service men and women currently serving in the Armed Forces, as of the grand list date of October 1st, are entitled to exemption of one vehicle. Application must be made no later than 14 months following the grand list date.

For example, anyone seeking this exemption for the October 1, 2015 grand list (July 2016 billing) must file his or her application with the Assessor's office no later than December 31, 2016. FEDERAL SOLDIERS AND SAILORS EXEMPTION

If you are an Out-of-State resident who is stationed in Connecticut and have a motor vehicle registered in the State of Connecticut, you may be eligible for the Federal Soldiers and Sailors Exemption Program. This program provides that personal property belonging to an active duty service member is not subject to local tax because of military orders. The only exception to this rule is business personal property owned by a service member, which can be assessed and taxed by the taxing jurisdiction in which it is located. The program allows for exemption of any motor vehicle registered in the service member's name.

Application process: An application must be completed by the service member and sworn to before a notary public or a commissioned officer having attained the grade of ensign or above and returned to the Assessor's office. To download an application, please click on the link below:
